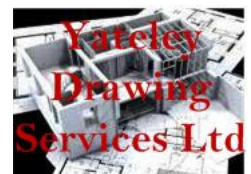

1 Welcome

Welcome to the 2011 Yateley Road Race Series, organised by Sandhurst Joggers and supported by Yateley Lions and 3rd Bramshill Scouts. The Yateley Road Races are organised by runners, for runners. We always welcome feedback so that we can continue to maintain the high standards of the event.

The course is basically unchanged from recent years. A combined start-finish is used to accommodate the chip timing mats as usual. Please take heed of the marshals around the course as they are there for YOUR safety. Keep to the left at all times unless told otherwise, especially along the Reading Road.

You will need to arrive in plenty of time to pick up your Race Pack which will include your number and ChampionChip. The Race HQ will be open from 6pm and remember the race starts promptly at **7.30pm**.

In addition to the 10K races and back by popular demand, we are pleased to present the Yateley 2K Fun Run! This will take place on the field, during the main race and you can enter for this race on the night - young and old are all welcome to join in!

3 Safety

3.1 First Aid/Medical Care

Please specify any medical conditions on the reverse of your race number writing in a ball-point pen along with any special medical treatment, to assist medical staff should you encounter any difficulties. Medical care is available in the School grounds and a Red Cross ambulance is available if required. Should you experience any problems during the event, please contact any marshal or official who will be able to contact the medical staff. If you drop out for any reason, please hand your number and chip to any marshal or other official and tell them where you are going. If you are unwell or injured on the day, please do not run. There will be other races - there is only one of you!

3.2 Course Safety

The risk assessment for the course will be available in the hall on the evening of the three events. We have applied for road closures for Cricket Hill Lane which will be closed for a short time as runners pass through. For further information on this, please see the website which will be updated regularly as the first race draws near. A Safety Car will lead runners, and marshals will be strategically placed to guide you around the course. Please keep to the left hand side of the road unless instructed by a marshal or official. This is for your own safety as on some roads traffic may be flowing against you. Runners must not be accompanied by dogs or followed by others on cycles, motorbikes or cars. The course is unsuitable for wheelchairs. Please note that failure to obey the instructions given by police and race marshals could place you in danger and could lead to your disqualification.

3.3 Dogs

Dogs cannot accompany their owners running the course for safety reasons.



4 Directions and Facilities

4.1 Getting to the Course

The nearest railway stations are at Camberley, Sandhurst and Blackwater, several miles from the start. Only infrequent bus services operate. Competitors travelling by car will find Yateley easily accessible via Camberley and Basingstoke A30 or M3 (exit 4 or 4A). Follow signs to Yateley by taking the A30 from Camberley, the A327/B3272 from Reading, or the A3095 from Bracknell. The Yateley Centre is situated in School Lane, off Firgrove Road, Grid Ref. SU809605. Post code GU46 6NW. It is within the Yateley School grounds.

4.2 Car Parking

Car parking for 400 cars is available at Yateley Centre. Please follow the directions of the Parking Marshals. We ask that you please be considerate of local residents in your driving and parking. There will be additional car parks at Yateley Village Hall, St Swithun's Church and Yateley Town Council Offices so please use these for a quick getaway.

4.3 Changing

There is limited changing accommodation and showers at Yateley Centre, so runners are advised to arrive changed with outer clothing on.

4.4 Baggage and Valuables

A baggage area will be available in the Sports Hall and will be manned by officials at all times. You will need to use one of the labels provided and have your number on it. To collect your kit you will need your running number. Although the area will be manned we cannot take any responsibility for any damage or losses. If you do not agree with the terms please do not deposit your baggage.

We strongly advise you not leave valuables in cars or the changing rooms. The baggage area provided is more secure

4.5 Toilets

Toilets are available in the changing rooms, upstairs in the Sports Centre and external Port-a-loos. Please do not water the boundary hedges & trees!

4.6 T-Shirts

These can be collected from the sports hall on production of your race number or identification. If you would like to buy one, but did not order one when you entered, please email jfgray1983@hotmail.com 2 weeks before the race. Other memorabilia will also be on sale in the sports hall. Refreshments will be on sale before, during and after the race. Sports kit will be available from the Sweatshop stand.



4.7 Sports Massage

At all three events, **Sports Massages** will be available. If you haven't had one before they are thoroughly recommended for easing muscle ache and preventing injuries. The experienced Massage Practitioners will be available from 7pm on the day for Pre *and* Post-Race preventative/troubleshooting, as well as recovery treatments and advice. Pre-booking of post-event massages prior to the race is strongly advised to avoid queuing (payment on booking). Rates: £5 per 10min session to cover the cost of oils and towels.

N.B. A Pre-Race Massage should be used to complement with a warm-up and does not replace one!

5 Race Info

5.1 Countdown

6pm-7pm	Arrival of Runners and Spectators - Chip and Number Collection
7:00pm	Runner Kits to be placed in baggage tent
7:05pm	Runners should be on field
7:10pm	Aerobic Warm-up
7:20pm	First call for start
7:25pm	Assemble at the start (in realistic predicted finishing time order)
7:30pm	Race Start - Enjoy the race
7:40pm	2k Fun Run Race Start

5.2 Timing

All runners in the race will be allocated both gun and chip times. The results will reflect the gun time the difference is as follows:

- Gun time -the time from the starting 'gun' to crossing the finishing line. Your race time.
- Chip time -the time from crossing the starting line to crossing the finishing line. Your actual time.

Prizes will be allocated according to 'gun' times as per IAAF Rule 165 (see below)

Rule 165.24e: The official time will be the time elapsed between the start gun and the athlete reaching the finish line (Gun Time). However, if an athlete crosses the start line after the start gun, his time elapsed between the start and finish line (Chip Time) can be made known to the athlete but will not be considered as official time. (Race prizes will be awarded using official time only)

5.3 ChampionChip

Please read the following instructions about ChampionChip carefully. All runners must wear the ChampionChip as directed in these instructions. The ChampionChip will be removed by an official after the finish line and placed in the designated receptacles. It is the responsibility of all participants to return their ChampionChip timing device as per the instructions in these Runners' Notes. Non-returned Chips will cost us £4.50 and thereby reduce the donations available to local beneficiaries.



5.4 ChampionChip Instructions

All entrants in the Yateley Road Race Series of events will be issued with a race pack on the race night.

In your race pack you will receive your RACE NUMBER and a special ENVELOPE which contains your CHIP. ChampionChip is a small timing device which is worn on your shoe. RaceAhead are providing the results service to our event which means that we are able to offer fast and accurate results with individual start times even when participants are at the back of the pack. The cost of the chip is included in the entry fee but entrants must return their chip to the organisers at the Finish line. Bins and helpers will be provided. If you drop out for any reason, please hand your number and chip to any marshal or other official and tell them where you are going.

Instructions on the use of your chip will be included with your Race Number and Runner Information.

Attaching your strap and ChampionChip

- 1) Loosen the laces of your running shoe.
- 2) Thread the strap under your laces.
- 3) Now thread the strap through both arms of your ChampionChip.
- 4) Insert the fastener through the desired hole and click the popper in place.
- 5) Ensure the popper and fastener has clicked together and is secure.

Warning: Once fastened the popper cannot be reopened!

The ChampionChip will accurately measure your time from the moment you cross the special mat at the Start Line to the moment you cross the mat at the Finish Line.

IF, FOR ANY REASON, YOU ARE UNABLE TO RUN OR FAIL TO CROSS THE FINISH LINE- PLEASE RETURN YOUR CHAMPIONCHIP, AS THIS WILL AVOID A FINANCIAL PENALTY TO US.

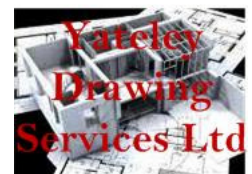
5.5 Drinks Station

Water will be available at around the **5K point** and finish and a sponge station will be at the **7K point**. If the weather is particularly hot there will also be water available at the **7K point**.



5.6 The Course

The 2011 race will be run over the same course as previous years. The race starts in the Yateley Centre fields & heads out onto School Lane turning left towards The Highwayman. At the roundabout turn left onto Monteagle Lane & then at the next roundabout turn right onto Vigo Lane, following Vigo Lane up the incline & turning left into Cricket Hill Lane. Follow Cricket Hill until reaching Handford Lane & turn left. Follow Handford Lane & then Hall Lane (Water Stop) until the roundabout with the Reading Road & turn left. KEEP LEFT & follow Reading Road heading out of Yateley & turn left into Marsh Lane (Sponge Stop). Turn left into Firgrove Road & at the roundabout turn right up the slight incline to The Highwayman. At the roundabout turn left into School Lane, on reaching the School turn right to finish.



6 Post Race

6.1 Results

Results will be displayed as soon as available and also posted on the Web site - www.yateley10kseries.info. No printed results will be available. If you have provided a mobile number then you may receive your result via text for free.

6.2 Trophies and Medals

Medals will be presented to all finishers in the finish area. There will be trophies awarded to series winners. **Presentation of trophies/prizes will be at approximately 8:40pm on Wednesday 3rd August.** There is a **£250** bonus for setting a new course record during the series (Records are: Men - 29:47, Women - 34:21).
